That's why to stand on the Scripture, to follow it's leading and guiding, will mean following ONLY Scripture in matters on which it speaks. As Luther said, "I am not so senseless as to be willing that the Word of God be made to give place to fables, devised by human reason."

#### Wednesday, October 30, 2013 — SOLA GRATIA

Ephesians 2:8-9 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faithand this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- not by works, so that no one can boast.

In the centuries preceding the Reformation, Aristotle was considered the king of philosophers. Though dead for centuries, his influence among churchmen and Bible scholars was supreme. This pagan's philosophic ideas became principles that governed the understanding of Scripture. One of the worst results of this was that saving grace was seen as "an ability God created in people so that they could do good works for their own salvation." When Martin Luther studied out the truth about grace in the Bible, here's what the Holy Spirit enabled him to find:

"According to the usage of Scripture grace signifies that favor of God, which wishes us well and justifies us. That is, it freely grants us the faith which alone justifies us.

"Grace consists in this, that God is merciful to us, shows himself gracious for the sake of the Lord Christ, forgives all sins and will not impute them to us for eternal death. This is grace, the forgiveness of sins for the sake of the Lord Christ, the covering up of all sins.

"We who, through our works are unprofitable servants are made children of God through the grace which God shows us in Christ."

Thanks be to God that he has restored to us this treasure -- and that we are able to teach our children from their earliest instruction that grace is God's undeserved love -- love that in Christ acts on behalf of us undeserving sinners.

## The Sermon – Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God. 20 Therefore by the deeds of the law no flesh will be justified in His sight, for by the law is the knowledge of sin. 21 But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe. For there is no difference; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith, to demonstrate His righteousness, because in His forbearance God had passed over the sins that

The sinner is justified (declared righteous) by God through faith in the work and death of Jesus, not by our work or keeping of the Law. Put another way, the sinner is justified by receiving (faith) rather than achieving (works). Later Luther would say that we are saved by the alien righteousness of Christ, that is, by a righteousness not of our own doing.

#### Tuesday, October 29, 2013 — SOLA SCRIPTURA

Psalm 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path.

The key question of the Reformation was: Who shall tell us God's truth concerning our soul's salvation?

It is not surprising that the answer Martin Luther found is evidenced in the very first of the 95 Theses he nailed to the door of Wittenberg's Castle Church on October 31, 1517.

"Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, in saying: 'Repent ye,' etc., intended that the whole life of believers should be penitence."

"Jesus Christ said ..." God led Luther to say and declare that whether the question was relics or indulgences or the Sacraments or anything pertaining to salvation the Word of the Lord is decisive. Indeed, Luther says that in matters pertaining to issues of salvation, "whatever does not have its origin in the Scriptures is surely from the devil himself."

Luther knew that if it was not SOLA Scriptura, then it wouldn't be Scripture at all ... not really ... not finally. Reason and dreams and human authority -- all that amend the Word really strike it out. To add to Scripture is to say it is not sufficient in matters of faith and life.

Luther remarks that it is a presumptuous abomination when men attempt "to teach God his lessons and blue-pencil the 'mistakes' of the Holy Ghost." Error first is satisfied with being accepted on a par with Scripture, but it is not long before it displaces the Truth.

#### Monday, October 28, 2013 — SOLA FIDE

Romans 3:28 Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith, apart from the deeds of the law.

Martin Luther was looking for peace when he became a monk. Instead he was brought face to face -- in a snarl that could not be untangled -- with a terrible contradiction. His church, on the one hand, offered him mercy in Christ, but on the other demanded he make amends for his sins.

The Scripture readings, prayers, hymns, and liturgy echoed the words of forgiveness, "Look to the crucified and risen Christ. He has defeated death and overcome the world." But then Luther was told, "Confess, do penance, mortify the flesh, do good works. And be sure you do as many good works as possible, for you never know where you stand. Be a monk, read masses, kneel before statues, pictures and relics, give alms."

"All depends on God." "All depends on you." This internal contradiction put a terrible strain on Luther. After all, if God, who knows us thoroughly, wishes to exercise judgment and justice, what comfort of His mercy remains? Furthermore, Luther asked in turmoil, "How do you love a God who demands such a single-minded love from sinners ... when He knows we cannot give it?"

No wonder then, that for Luther it was like "the doors of paradise had swung open" to him when God through His Word made him certain that the "righteousness of God" in passages like Romans 1:17 expressed the fact of God's free and saving grace, that this Scripture is not talking about the righteousness which God demands of us in the Law, but the righteousness that He freely gives to those who believe the Gospel.

were previously committed, 26 to demonstrate at the present time His righteousness, that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. 27 Where is boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith. 28 Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law.
