Old Testament Reading: Job 19:23-27 (NKJV)

23 "Oh, that my words were written! Oh, that they were inscribed in a book! 24 That they were engraved on a rock With an iron pen and lead, forever! 25 For I know that my Redeemer lives, And He shall stand at last on the earth; 26 And after my skin is destroyed, this I know, That in my flesh I shall see God, 27 Whom I shall see for myself, And my eyes shall behold, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!"

New Testament Reading: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 (NKJV)

¹³ But I do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning those who have fallen asleep, lest you sorrow as others who have no hope. ¹⁴ For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who sleep in Jesus. ¹⁵ For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep. ¹⁶ For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord. 18 Therefore comfort one another with these words.

Sermon Text: John 6:35-47 (NKJV)

35 And Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst. 36 But I said to you that you have seen Me and yet do not believe. 37 All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out. 38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. 39 This is the will of the Father who sent Me, that of all He has given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day. 40 And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day." 41 The Jews then complained about Him, because He said, "I am the bread which came down from heaven." 42 And they said, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How is it then that He says, 'I have come down from heaven'?" 43 Jesus therefore answered and said to them, "Do not murmur among yourselves. 44 No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him: and I will raise him up at the last day. 45 It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Therefore everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to Me. 46 Not that anyone has seen the Father, except He who is from God; He has seen the Father. 47 Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me has everlasting life."

Recycling Program at Faith - We have initiated two new recycling programs here at Faith which will help provide funds to ease our budget, provide for needed supplies, and generally assist in the work here at Faith. You will find the boxes for recycling on the shelves at the back of the church across from the coat rack.

Ink and Toner Cartridges - We are using a program which gives us \$2 for every recycled ink and toner cartridge we collect. In addition, there are NO limitations on which brands can be recycled. Every brand is accepted, even re-manufactured cartridges or cartridges from commercial copiers. So don't throw away your printer cartridges! Save your ink and toner cartridges at home and at work and recycle them here at church. The money collected will be used to buy needed supplies for our church.



Cell Phones - We are also starting a program to recycle used cell phones for cash. You will find another box at the back of the church for collecting cell phones. You can recycle any cell phone – even if it has a cracked screen or is no longer working. Many phones will be broken



down and the precious metals removed. The congregation will receive a check for phones that are recycled based on the value of each phone. The money we receive will be used to assist in the work of our congregation. If you have old cell phones laying around your home or office, please consider recycling them here at Faith.

You will find the two separate boxes for recycling at the back of the church. One is for ink/toner cartridges, and the other for cell phones. Please consider making use of these programs! If you have any questions about either program, please speak to Pastor Mayhew.
